Clean and disinfect workstations between each user. Surfaces that come in contact with skin or ink, such as armpits and changing paper areas, should always be covered with easily accessible disposable borders Ink should be disposed of in a disposable basket instead of being used all at once from shared luggage

Artists will scrub their hands very, very well to put on new gloves for each patron. The gloves stay on during the tattoo and must be changed without delay if they become dangerous during the consultation.

A visit to a tattoo parlor in Bath that pays attention to hygiene is generally no longer physical safety. Moreover, it shows the overall professionalism of the studio and
